Hello and Happy Easter

I recently visited Blackburn Cathedral, where they were displaying the work of Jacqui Parkinson called, Threads through Creation. The work was amazing to see; the amount of detail and meaning behind every stitch had been carefully thought through, not just in the individual pieces but as a bigger picture. The longer you took it in, the more there was to be seen of the stories of creation and of faith. The intricate details on each of the screens reminded me of the amount of detail there is in our own world. A collection of stitches made up a shape; just as a collection of cells can create an organism. So much time, effort and love had been given just to portray a story. Looking at those pieces caused me to reflect on how much time, effort and love God puts into our story.

Throughout the season of Lent, we were able to marvel and wonder at Jesus the healer, the miracle worker and the Messiah. Now as we celebrate the 50 days of Easter, we are reminded that things did not stop at the cross or the grave and we, like the disciples, are learning about our relationship with God through the resurrected Christ.

One of my favourite services at this time of year follows the Via Lucis, The Stations of the Resurrection. It is often held in an evening, with the sun just starting to set and after each station a candle is lit, until the worship space is filled with light. The service remembers the appearances of Jesus after the resurrection. In the service there is a repeated phrase, '...by the Wood of the Cross and the Light of the Resurrection...'; similarly to the Threads of Creation, it speaks of the hard work that goes into expressing faith and following God. But also, it reminds me of the challenge to step into the light and be seen expressing my belief in God through action.

In May this year, we will remember how the disciples watched Jesus ascend into heaven and a week later feel the gift of the Holy Spirit upon them. Together as believers they took the faith that had started to develop within them out to flourish in the world. They themselves became story tellers, everything that they said and did helped to weave the story of God.

As we celebrate this Easter season, may we remember that by the wood of the cross and the light of the resurrection, we have strength and power from God to meet the challenges that we face, to live our lives as people of the resurrection.

His funeral was packed out, with more chairs needing to be brought in, as he had touched the lives of so many people in the area. Our prayers go out to his family and friends.

DARE

On Friday the 15th of March 2024, despite the early showers of blessing, some members of the Darwen Asylum and Refugee Enterprise (DARE) assembled at the Central United Reformed Church Darwen to embark on a trip to Yorkshire Dales National Park for an environmental action of tree planting. "What is it with Lancashire and Yorkshire planting trees every time, everywhere?" was a question that shocked us from someone who saw us embarking on our trip. It was shocking because the environmental crisis is a much-talked issue worldwide with governments and civil society organisations trying to implement actions to protect the environment. At DARE, we come from various parts of the world, and we understand that throughout history, from our diverse cultures, trees have played a significant role, providing essential

resources such as sustenance, fuel, shelter, clothing, barriers, weaponry, and a wide array of everyday objects. The UK has been a meeting point of diverse cultures for decades now, with each contributing some unique perspectives and beliefs about the importance of trees. A minibus with sixteen persons from countries like: Botswana, Iran, Pakistan, Afghan, Egypt, Cameroon, South Africa, and the Netherlands could quickly explain the joy and wealth of knowledge for this trip to plant trees at the Yorkshire Dales National Park.

The day and activity coincided with the birthday of one of the members in the team, Reverend Gilbert who serves as URC minister with the Lancashire East Missional Partnership. Gilbert felt it was an important day in his life and has thus come to understand the complexity of life. He said: "this tree being planted on my birthday is so symbolic for me because I know the one who plants trees knowing that he/she will never sit in their shade has at least started to understand the meaning of life" This symbolic action of tree planting by members of DARE clearly shows the importance that trees can still hold within public imagination. At DARE, our conviction is that trees represent connectedness, beauty, nature, and purifying cleanliness. It is therefore important that we keep such values by continuing to plant trees which we believe will one day become landscape icons wherever they are planted. We planted a little over fifty trees. We were also happy to see that the trees planted in the previous year were doing well. After the tree planting exercise, our guide took us for a walk around the park and to the Malham Cliff. We later retired to the village hall where we had a mix of delicious soup and a birthday cake shared.

We remain grateful first to God who made it possible, and then to Judy, Rosie, Nick, Marjan, and Daleen. By God's grace, we are hoping to have another trip as part of our activities geared at protecting the environment.


